Penna. State Insurance Department Examiners' Report

Honorable Matthew H. Taggart, Insurance Commissioner, Harrisburg, Pa. Philadelphia, September 9, 1929.

In accordance with instructions contained in Certificate of Authority No. 201, File 682, an examination has been made of the LITHUANIAN ALLIANCE OF AMERICA, a Fraternal benefit association...

HISTORY.

The Lithuanian Alliance of America was incorporated as a fraternal beneficial association November 4, 1889 by the Court of Common Pleas of Luzerne County, Pennsylvania...

PURPOSE.

The Alliance was formed for the following purposes: (1) The uniting in fraternal bonds Lithuanians, male and female, of good character...

(2) The establishment and maintenance of funds from contributions by its members for the following uses: (a) The payment of death, disability and sick benefits...

GOVERNMENT.

The Supreme Assembly, which meets in regular session every two years is the highest authority within the Association. It exercises all powers and authority granted the Alliance under its charter.

Each subordinate lodge is entitled to elect one representative to the Supreme Assembly. Lodges with more than 30 members are entitled to an additional delegate...

MANAGEMENT.

The active management of the affairs of the Alliance is delegated by the Supreme Assembly to a Supreme Executive Board, the members of which are elected by the Assembly...

MEMBERSHIP (adults).

Any Lithuanian, male or female, or such as are allied by marriage or adoption with a Lithuanian, or those who have rendered distinguished service to the Lithuanian nationality...

The Alliance as of December 31, 1928 had an adult membership of 19,408 with \$8,636,800 of insurance in force...

CERTIFICATES, BENEFITS AND RATES.

CERTIFICATES. The Alliance issued one form of Whole Life Certificate in four classes, namely, \$150, \$300, \$600 and \$1,000.

RATES. The rates applied by the Alliance are based on the National Fraternal Congress Table with an interest assumption of four per cent.

In addition to the net monthly rates assessable against each certificate, each member pays 15c. monthly for administration purposes...

DEATH BENEFITS.

Death benefits are payable within ninety days after final proof of death of such member has been received by the Supreme Secretary.

- In the event of death of a member in good standing after six months of membership, his or her beneficiary shall receive a percentage of the benefits payable determined as follows:
Membership of 6-12 months 25%
Membership of 12-18 months 50%
Membership of 18-24 months 75%
Membership of 24 months or longer 100%

In the event of death occurring within six months, the beneficiary of such deceased member is entitled to the refund of all benefits assessments paid.

DISABILITY BENEFITS.

For the permanent loss of sight of both eyes, loss of leg or arm, or both arms or legs by severance at or above the wrist or ankle...

OLD AGE BENEFITS.

Any member in good standing upon attaining the age of 70 years, or over, who has been a member for not less than twenty-five (25) years may upon petition to the Supreme Assembly...

SICK BENEFITS.

Members of the adult branch of the Alliance may also be admitted to either one of the three Sick Benefit Classes, and in the event of illness, after six months of membership...

DISCUSSION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENT. The balance of \$1,039,653.91, used as a starting point in the examination represents the total ledger assets of the Alliance for the year ending December 31, 1928...

INCOME AND DISBURSEMENTS. The income of the Alliance is derived chiefly from monthly assessments or dues paid by its membership into the Mortuary, Disability, Juvenile, Philanthropic and Administration Funds...

ASSETS. The assets of the Alliance as carried on its books and shown in this report consists of Real Estate, Mortgage Loans, Bonds Cash and Loans to Students, viz: REAL ESTATE \$50,000.00. The real estate consists of a four-story brick building situated at 307 W. 30th Street, in New York City on lot 25 x 98 feet. The first and second floors are used by the society for office and printing plant purposes...

Benefits and monthly assessments therefor, are as follows: FULL BENEFITS MONTHLY DUES Class 1 \$1.00 per day \$30, Class 2 1.50 per day .60, Class 3 2.00 per day .90.

In addition to the above dues, there is an initiation fee of \$1.50, \$2.25 and \$3.00 each of the above classes, respectively, and 5c. per member monthly for expense purposes, also a fee of \$2.00 for transferring from one class to another.

JUVENILE MEMBERSHIP. Any child, of the Lithuanian Nationality, male or female, between two and eighteen years of age, of good physical health, may be admitted to membership in the Juvenile Department.
